























































When the World was Ours by Liz Kessler - TMSA Big Read 2023 Vienna, 1936.






The Giver by Lois Lowry - TMSA Big Read 2022




Children of Blood and Bone by Tom Adyemi



Sixteen-year-old Katniss Everdeen regards it as a death sentence when she is forced to represent her district in the annual Hunger Games, a fight to the death on live TV. But Katniss has been close to death before-and survival, for her, is second nature. The Hunger Games is a searing novel set in a future with unsettling parallels to our present. 


15 Days without a Head by Dave Cousins

Instead, he attempts to keep up the pretence that Mum is still around: dressing up in her clothes to trick the neighbours and spinning an increasingly complicated tangle of lies.

When Apple's mother returns after eleven years of absence, Apple feels whole again. She will have an answer to her burning question - why did you go? And she will have someone who understands what it means to be a teenager - unlike Nana. 




Gone by Michael Grant






Magnus Chase and the Sword of Summer by Rick Riordan






The Everest Files by Matt Dickinson






Beckham by Matt and Tom Oldfield




Heartstopper by Alice Oseman
