Attendance Matters

Unbelievably we have quickly passed the first half term for this academic year. Our current attendance stands at over 95% but we need to improve this so that out attendance is consistently over our target of 96%.

We are a school that sets ourselves high expectations in all areas and attendance is no exception. Attending school is extremely important for children's social, emotional and educational development and children who miss a lot of time at school can suffer in the long term from significant gaps in their learning. We need your support to ensure that children's education is not affected through missing time from school.

I therefore would like to take this opportunity to remind all parents/carers of the following:

- Registration begins at 8.40am prompt. We ask that all students arrive at 8.30am to avoid them being late.
- Please leave a message on each day of absence. It is for school to decide if an absence is authorised or unauthorised.
- Please phone daily unless you have made arrangements with your child's Director of Learning or the Attendance Officer. We do not know if you have sent your child to school and need to know this in order to keep them safe. If we receive no message we will endeavour to contact you but we must have at least two up-to-date emergency contact numbers on record to be able to do this.

Ivy has settled in so quickly and is treasured by the whole family, Ivy has made a wonderful difference in Emma's life.
