Over the next two weeks Year 7 students will have the opportunity to participate in workshops with visitors and speakers from the UK's leading anti-racism educational charity, Show Racism the Red Card. This Tuesday the students were fortunate to also have the ex England, Watford and AC Milan player, Luther Blissett as one of the leaders of a workshop.

Luther Blissett, England and Watford legend, is now educating today's youth on the consequences of racism in society as part of the Show Racism the Red Card charity. Blissett and his colleagues came into The Marlborough Science Academy, to work with Year seven and eight students. From observing, the charity wanted the students to feel comfortable to be able to talk about someone's skin colour, whilst at the same time, acknowledging the right and wrong ways to describe someone's appearance. In a glistening career where he famously became England's first ever black goal scorer, Blissett paved the way for black players to play a part in the English football team. He described this achievement as "a great landmark." He followed on by highlighting the massive importance of representing his country. "As a kid you want to play for your country, you want to put the shirt on, you want to play at Wembley stadium, and if you're a striker you want to score at Wembley. And for me it all came true, it was a boyhood dream."

The late Graham Taylor also had a big impact on not only Blissett as a footballer, but as a person too. "He made everyone feel together, he gave you good direction and he was always straight and honest with you." He followed on to state the impact Taylor had on him as a young player. "He was very organised and focused and he wanted his players to be the same. He kind of blended all of us into a fantastic unit of players." Blissett also explained how he has used this in the sessions he runs for Show Racism the Red Card. "now when I do the racism days with the kids that's what I try to get across to them, that they're so much stronger when they work together."



Although holding the record for Watford's most appearances, and being their top scorer, Blissett was very modest about his career achievements. "Everybody keeps telling me that [being a Watford Legend], but when I played it was never something that ever crossed my mind. And now people say you're the top goal scorer, but it doesn't mean anything in that respect, even now." He continued to say that he is optimistic that someone will break his records. "I hope somebody will be at the club long enough to hopefully go on and beat that and set another bench mark for someone else to go along to."

The Show Racism the Red Card charity is such an amazing organisation. They work across the UK, using sport to tackle racism in young people. Volunteer Ose described what the charity aims to do "It's an anti-racism education charity. We're doing some educational workshops with Year 7 and 8 trying to let them know how racism works and what we can do about it, as a community, a school and society." Tackling racism from a young age is so important, not only in sport, but in life. Developing young people to be respectful in an ever growing racial, religious and differentiated society is vital, and the volunteers at the Show Racism the Red Card are doing a fantastic job.

Last Thursday Conor Jackson, Academic Relationship Manager, from UCFB Wembley came to talk to the Year 12 students about the ever changing pace of the business world. They were given a 40 minute task to work together as a team on producing a sports industry product or service business concept, to think about the customer service, role of technology and social media and the importance of creativity thinking. Ideas included spray on football kits, mobile app for local and national sporting events, virtual training goggles, dog walking marathon, and sport goggles to watch matches from the comfort of your own home. Students were interested to hear how many career pathways there are linked to sports and the options there are available to them after Year 13. They were told about the importance of any job application, cv or personal statement and including experience gained to show initiative.

As one of only three schools who have this partnership in England, Marlborough students have the opportunity for these presentations on business, team building and finance and have already had the opportunity to sample a degree style session workshop on a visit to Wembley and hope in the future to benefit from work experience opportunities.



Rebecca Bradley, School's Liaison Officer from Cambridge University came in to give some tips and advice to the Year 13 students on their university applications. They were advised about the importance of their personal statements and the necessity of explaining why they want to study a particular degree and how they are suitable for the course.

Alchemy

The Year 13 Chemistry students are currently learning about carbonyls and in particular the identification of compounds known as aldehydes and ketones.

One of the chemical methods uses a chemical called Tollen's Reagent. This solution contains dissolved silver ions that when reacted with an aldehyde causes silver metal to be deposited on the inside of the flask. This produces a very impressive positive result called a silver mirror. Below is an example of this 'silver mirror'.
