Author Visit

Last week we welcomed Tony Lee, a New York Times Best-selling Graphic Novelist, to Marlborough. As well as writing a variety of comics and graphic novels, he is also known for adapting other people's work, where he would take a book (like *Pride & Prejudice and Zombies*, or *Raven's Gate*) and turn them into a comic or graphic novels. As well as comics he has written several novels aimed at reluctant readers published by *Badger Learning*, including *Stalker*, *Mister Scratch*, *Doctor Jekyll and Little Miss Hyde*, *Otis*, *Noticed* and *Jigsaw Lady*, as well as several audio plays for *Big Finish*, including the *Doctor Who* Fifth Doctor adventure *Rat Trap*.

His day began firstly with two 1 hour talks in Da Vinci Hall with a large variety of students, including Year 6 students from Abbey, St Michaels and St Peters. His talk mainly concentrating on 'Changing the Channel' which encourages students who might not like what they are reading to find something else that's more enjoyable to them. He also talked about his writing experiences and he even made them all jump at the end with a very spooky story!

The rest of the day comprised of working with students in a workshop format, which encouraged them to use their imagination to create resourceful and occasionally very funny methods to avoid a zombie attack.

It was a long and exhausting day for Tony but the visit was very successful with students coming away with a more positive and determined attitude to try out new reading experiences.

Attendance

As a school we are continuing to focus on attendance and punctuality. Thank you so much to all of you who have been working hard to ensure children's punctuality and attendance remains high.

We were really pleased as a school to have had record attendance last year. There is a strong link between attendance and achievement and, therefore it is very important that your child attends school every day unless there are exceptional circumstances.

As you are aware, both at Key Stage 4 and 5 we achieved our best academic results which we were delighted about and our so proud of all of their hard work. Please see below how attendance played a crucial part in this for our Year 11 students:

Students whose attendance fell between 95-100% achieved +0.38 higher than their peers; a third of a grade better. This attendance band contained the most significant number of students. Where attendance dropped to between 90-95% students were -0.58 below target, over half a GCSE grade. Our smallest group, 7 students whose attendance was between 85-90%, were affected by -1.4, nearly one and a half GCSE grades.

90% attendance = half a day missed every week! One school year at 90% = 4 weeks of learning missed!

Young people nationally whose school attendance is 90% or below are considered to be persistent absentees.

Punctuality matters too!

Missed minutes equals missed learning which equals missed opportunities! As a school we are aware lateness can severely affect achievement as well. Registration begins at 8.40am and all students are expected to be at school on time. Without a genuine reason from parents/carers your child will be marked as late in the register if they arrive after this time. Persistent lateness can result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued. If your child does arrive after the register has closed they must immediately report to the school attendance office to sign in to ensure their safeguarding.

Family holidays and term time leave

All requests for authorised absences need to be put in writing to the Headteacher and will only be authorised in the most exceptional of circumstances.

If permission is not granted, and your child is still absent, the absence is classed as unauthorised and parents/carers will be and have been issued with penalty notice warning letters.
