Year 8 Workshadowing

On Wednesday 8th November the whole of Year 8 were involved in our Work Shadowing day. More students than ever managed to secure themselves an external placement, most of them with a parent or carer and there were some really interesting and varied jobs shadowed including quantity surveyor, early years teacher, farm worker, bricklayer and chocolatier. Thanks to Joe Latham who spent the day at Hotel Chocolat and brought in some of their lovely chocolates for the LRC team.

Those unable to find a placement out of school shadowed a member of our staff including the Site Manager, Finance Assistants and Science Technicians.

Year 8 have been thinking about careers in their PSHCEE lessons this term and the feedback from the work shadowing has been really positive.

My Work Shadowing Experience

'It was about a 45-minute commute by car from St Albans to my Dad's workplace in Amersham – Halma Plc. Thankfully, the traffic was not too bad and we arrived around 8.45 AM. When we arrived I was surprised that the building looked like a big house rather than an office.

The receptionist was a nice lady and greeted us as we went through. I found the building very nice and calm. We went up two flights of stairs and entered the room my dad worked in. It was quiet with two people happily typing away at their desk but would you believe it – everyone had a triple screen setup, including my dad. My dad introduced them to me as Darren (my Dad's boss) and Paula, who managed Graduate Recruitment. He has a nice boss

I watched my dad do some work checking emails and then I sat in a teleconference (a meeting via the phone and laptop) while my Dad discussed the risk and audit software he was implementing for the company. It sounded complicated. I then spoke to two people in the IT department who talked to me about their jobs and what they do. Then Anne talked to me about graduate recruitment and gave me a puzzle given to the graduates. It would normally take them 2 to 3 hours to complete, but I completed it in 45 minutes. Everyone was impressed.

My dad took me to a restaurant for lunch and I had pizza and mineral water. When we came back I helped the receptionist to put letters in envelopes. I then watched my dad do some work and he explained more about risk management and audit. He has many different parts to his job. He has to manage audits and business improvements, manage the control certifications and monitor and report on all the risks in the company as well as do fraud investigations. He is also implementing a computer program at the moment. I found some parts of

my dad's job straightforward but some of it was very complex. I don't think I want to do this job when I am older but I am happy that I got to see where he works.

We talked about the day as we drove back home which took about 50 minutes. I am glad I don't commute that long every day.

Year 12 visit UCFB, Wembley



'UCFB's visit to The Marlborough Science Academy has not only left me extremely fascinated but has also encouraged me to really chase my dream career path by providing something I didn't think was possible, a clear pathway towards my end goal. UCFB's first visit consisted of a general overview of their university providing us with basic yet enticing information about their courses, talking about a range of courses consisting of pathways as rare to find as 'sports coaching and management' and 'sports law/business'.

After the talk those interested approached Jason Thomas (the speaker) who was – from my own experience – very helpful in providing further knowledge of the course each person was interested in.

After this the interested students went to visit Wembley to talk to another of UCFB's spokespeople Jordan Hearn who once again provided similar knowledge of the university. This trip allowed us to talk to Jordan Hearn and learn more about the course while visiting a seminar room and also taking a very enjoyable tour of Wembley Stadium itself.

The day after this trip Jason Thomas came back to Marlborough to talk about interviews, after providing the whole of Year 12 with some interview tips we went on to carry out some mock interviews with our peers before Jason requested a volunteer (turning out to be myself) to act out an interview with he first as the employer and then Jason as an employer for me. Jason first acted out a bad interview, particularly portraying the things we shouldn't do ourselves in the situation of an interview. After this example he asked me to show the example of a perfect interview, I was interviewing for the business role of a sports coach (very beneficial as the UCFB course I'd like to take is titled 'Sports Coaching and Management') I acted out this interview to the best of my ability after being asked questions like 'why are you leaving your current employer' and 'How well do you work as a team member and how well do you work as an individual' and after the completion of it was congratulated by Jason who seemed more then satisfied with my responses.

Overall all visits from UCFB and the visit to Wembley itself have left me more than encouraged and inspired to work as hard as I can to achieve what is necessary to carry out the career path I'd like to travel. I feel like all visits were also extremely helpful in my overview of universities as a whole providing me with general and valuable knowledge that can be used in any future direction I choose to take.'





Holly Rubens from 'Herts Health NHS as one' spoke to Year 12 and 13 students about good mental health and the services provided to support young people.

Outlining how:

- low mood, depression effects 1 in 4 people in the UK.
- 1 in 5 young people between ages 16 and 24 develop psychological problems and 50% develop these issues from the age of 14.
- 80% of young people believe mental health problem could lead to discrimination.

Mental health issues including depression, anxiety, low self esteem, panic attacks, anger difficulties and sleep difficulties. The Wellbeing team include Psychological Well Being Practitioners and high intensity CBT therapists and Silver Cloud.

A better Abbey Line for everyone

Abbey Flyer Users' Group is currently crowdfunding for a feasibility study into expanding the train service

Lets show how great the Abbey Line could be!! Great for commutes, family leisure explorations and as a gateway to Hertfordshire. A great community railway for the community!!

We want to show why it is important for there to be investment in the Abbey Line, initially with the addition of a passing loop. This would enable two trains to operate on the line and allow for a doubling of the current train frequency. To do this we need to commission a study to identify the benefits from increased revenue, reduction in car use, more efficient and quicker journeys, reduced overcrowding on the Thameslink route, improved reliability etc. Additionally we need to understand the costs of the passing-loop and the running costs of a second train. Once we have the benefits and the costs we can then present these to the council so that they can consider investing and realising the vision.
