What a fantastic start we have made to the new school year, students have come back this September with positive attitudes to learning and a real sense of direction. Our 224 Year 7s have really settled quickly and already they are telling us that they feel safe, settled and enjoying their learning. The Year 11s look terrific in their new ties and so far their commitment to learning has been impressive.

Our results this year were very pleasing indeed, our A*-C including English and Maths figure increased by 7% this year from last and our progress 8 figure showing value added is positive. Year 13 results at A level were most impressive and we are delighted to wave many of them off to pastures new including Cambridge and the Royal Veterinary School—some great students and we will miss them. Open Evening was a great success on Thursday and jam packed with families embarking on the whole business of picking the right school for their children. I want to say a huge and heartfelt thank you to all the children who helped promote our school; they worked incredibly hard. Particularly impressive were the choir who were exhausted after a full week of rehearsals and back to back performances, they kept going though and their resilience was admirable. 
