Key Concepts Taught



- Living with natural hazards, extreme weather, the causes and impacts of climate change, urban issues, ecosystems, tropical rainforest, cold environments, UK landscapes, and the changing economic world.
- Key concepts are taught through using OS maps, fieldwork around the school site, online research, documentaries, teach led learning and decision-making tasks.
