

## WHAT IS IT?

Used when talking about something that is **going to** happen.

## **EXAMPLES IN ENGLISH**

I am going to go shopping tonight. You are going to eat a hamburger. He is going to visit his friend who is called Joe. We are going to watch a film. They are going to go to the beach with my mum.

## HOW DO I FORM IT?

1. Take the **present tense of 'ir'**:

Voy – I am going Vas – You (singular) are going Va – He/she is going Vamos – We are going Vais – You (plural) are going Van – They are going

2. Plus **'a'** and an **infinitive**, e.g:

Ir - to go
Hacer - to do
jugar - to play
comer - to eat
ver - to watch/see



## **EXAMPLES IN SPANISH**

Voy a ir de compras esta noche. Vas a comer una hamburguesa. Va a visitar a su amigo que se llama Joe. Vamos a ver una película. Van a ir a la playa con mi madre.
