School Access

Early Students

Student Achievements

Yet more amazing achievements by our students -



Sean Neveling 7MK

Sean is a national tennis player for his age group and attends regional and national training camps. During

the winter 2015/16 season he finished No 2 in the country on the national leader board and is based at Batchwood Tennis Academy. He has won a number of U14/U16 county events last term as well as coming runner up in a few regional events. He qualified for his first boys U12 national event in December and won his 2^{nd} boys U14 grade 4 county event in Southampton.

Sean most recently won a regional boys U12 Grade 3 event in Essex just after Christmas – and also participated in the national boys U12 Grade 2 just after Christmas – here he won his 2 matches in his qualification round and progressed to the main draw of 32. He won his first round but was knocked out in the 2nd round. This is a great achievement considering this is only his 2nd season at U12 and most boys at this level are a year older in their last season. These two events helped him to move up on the national boys U12 rankings table and should also enable him to qualify for the next national G2 to be

played in Bath. This last week he also moved up to a 6.1 level rating (there are only 7 other boys at this level across the UK).

We look forward to hearing how Sean gets on playing for Hertfordshire in the 12 Counties Cup to be played in February. He will play Cambridgeshire, Oxfordshire and Nottinghamshire in this one day event.

Oliver Tarvet 8AG

Oliver also attends the Batchwood Tennis Academy and trains 16 hours a week. Oliver had a successful training camp in Roehampton last week with the national squad and received very positive feedback regarding his attitude and progression.

The LTA have given Oliver a wild card for a Grade One Tennis Europe event in Bolton this week. This is the biggest international event on the British calendar and will give him the opportunity to compete with top European players in the U14 age group.


Most companies will have an apprentice at the stand to talk to students about their experience. This is a great opportunity to find out how apprenticeships work and how to apply should you wish to.
