


Student Achievements

An exciting opportunity has arisen at our oversubscribed and rated "good" academy for students from 11 to 19 years of age, for a Higher Level Assistant Teacher to work as part of our Specialised Learning Faculty and line manage our team of Assistant Teachers. We are looking for an individual with outstanding classroom skills and SEN experience who can support students who need particular help to overcome barriers to learning in a main stream educational setting. You will need to be a team player but also be able to work independently, show great flexibility and have outstanding communication and organisation skills. Ideally the successful candidate will be a qualified HLTA or have a comparative level 4 qualification or be working towards this.

You will collaborate with teachers in planning and delivering programs of teaching and learning activities for classes. The primary focus is to undertake educational activities with individuals, groups and whole classes within a framework agreed with and under the overall direction and supervision of a qualified teacher.

You should ideally be able to demonstrate a successful track record in leading, motivating and organising a team. The ability to manage a team effectively is equally important in this role to any SEN and teaching experience. You will line manage and organise a team of Assistant Teachers to help support students achieve effective learning and also to support the SENCO administratively and work alongside the SEN Admin Assistant.
