#### The Merlin Centre



The Merlin Centre, named after Merlin Williams, a much loved and highly respected colleague, who passed away two years ago was officially opened by Merlin's son Adam on 26th November.

Speaking at the official opening, headteacher Annie Thomson said: "We are delighted with our new modern building designed not only to enhance our students' learning, but also to allow us to accommodate our growing number of post-16 students comfortably. In

addition, we are sure our new state-of-the-art music facilities will continue to reflect our commitment to the arts and creativity."

Guests at the opening included members of staff, past and present, governors, and representatives from Elbourn Architects and Aldwicks Building Company who designed and constructed the new block which will be used to accommodate the school's increasing number of post 16 students.

We are delighted to introduce our new app 'Edulink One'. This exciting new resource will provide you with the most up to date information and data relating to your child. We have initially launched it with the following features:

- Timetable information
- Achievement information (instantly find out when your child has earned pinkies or house points).
- Home learning information (personalised home learning instructions for your child)



• Book parent consultation appointments (only prior to parent consultation events).

Many more features are being rolled out over the next few weeks including behaviour data, attendance, catering balance, etc.

Please install the app on a smartphone or tablet by searching for 'Edulink One' (created by Overnet Data) in your app store. Alternatively you can access Edulink One online by visiting <a href="https://www.edulinkone.com/">https://www.edulinkone.com/</a>
