In August, the netball club started individual fitness training outdoors. This was followed by the


resumption of proper (outdoor) training sessions in September.


















Competitions

The Secret Annex





Our next Virtual Encounter will take place on **THURSDAY 10th DECEMBER 2020** (3:30pm) and the theme will be

CAREERS in MOTOR TRADE INDUSTRY

The Motor Trade is about far more than mechanics and second hand car salesmen (although it will still require these roles in the future too!) This webinar explores the different careers opportunities in the industry with a particular focus on some of the Automotive Technology and Engineering posts that will be required in light of changing technology.

We will joined by representatives of The Institute of Motor Industry, Autotech and Skillnet - a leading training and apprenticeship provider that works with many Motor Trade employers in Hertfordshire and further afield.

Gavin White is the CEO of Autotech Group. Having studied Business Studies at College, at the age of 19 he had a brief few years as a water cooler service technician, before taking on his first junior sales role in the fork truck industry. After taking voluntary redundancy, he travelled the world for around 2 years, before finding his next role selling advertising for a well-known Motoring Magazine. This then led to a very successful career in the Motor Trade, with a brief 2 year gap in the recruitment industry serving the Energy & Utilities sector.

This gave him the inspiration to start Autotech Recruit Ltd in 2010, which now employees 30 direct heads at the companies HQ in Milton Keynes and around 450 contractors across the UK. With a vision to improve access to young talent and skills for the motor trade, Gavin is now embarking on two new ventures Autotech Training and Autotech Academy to help grow Autotech Group and support the automotive industry well in to the future.

Windows/Mac Laptop or Chromebook?



Parents and carers often ask us for advice on whether they should purchase a Chromebook or a Windows/Mac laptop for their child. Although we can't tell you which to opt for, we can explain some of the key differences. If you are making the choice between these two devices, hopefully this information will be useful.



Chromebooks

Chromebooks are devices which use Google's Chrome Operating System and are designed to browse the Internet and to use online 'cloud'-based tools such as Google Docs.

Windows/Mac Laptops

Laptop computers are available with Windows and Mac user interfaces. This tends to be a matter of preference and it is worth taking a look at demo models in the shops. Students are used to using Windows at school.

To summarise – if you are looking for a device for browsing the Internet, using Google Classroom and performing basic tasks like creating Word documents and presentations then a Chromebook may be a good choice. If it is likely your child will need to do more on the device, particularly where this requires specialist software to be installed, then a Windows/Mac laptop might be the better option.
