### Accelerated Reader

All students in Years 7, 8 and 9 are enrolled in a reading scheme called Accelerated Reader. Students take a comprehension test to assess their reading ability and this helps to guide them to select appropriate reading material. When students finish a book on the scheme they can take a short online quiz to check their understanding of what they have read. Students earn house points for each quiz that they pass.

# H AJJ & E I D

Hajj - 7th of July  
Eid - 9th of July



**1 Million pilgrims traveled to Saudi Arabia to perform Hajj.**

Hajj is a rite of passage, and is the fifth and final pillar of Islam. It is a long, but rewarding journey to the Kaaba in Makkah, which for Muslims is regarded as Allah's House built by Prophet Ibrahim (as).

## Eid

Muslims around the world celebrate Eid al-Adha, a religious holiday which in Arabic means the "festival of the sacrifice".

The festival marks the end of Hajj, the five-day pilgrimage Muslims undertake to Islam's holiest city, Mecca, and surrounding areas of western Saudi Arabia to cleanse the soul of sins and instill a sense of equality and brotherhood.

Eid al-Adha commemorates the story of Prophet Ibrahim's test of faith when he was commanded by God to sacrifice his son, Ismail.

The belief holds that God stayed his hand, sparing the boy and placing a ram in his place.

The day is marked with the sacrifice of an animal, usually a goat, sheep, or cow, and the distribution of the meat among neighbors, family members, and the poor.

## Hajj - A Time for Unity

Muslims wear white during the days of Hajj this presents equality and celebrates diversity.

## Site Developments

The school never sleeps and this summer we are really excited that we have a great deal of site improvement work planned, all focussed on improving the learning environment and just making it a nice place to be.

The work we are intending to do is outlined below:

- The new building is progressing well and by the end of the summer the roof should be on.
- Our drama room is being refurbished and will provide better facilities and opportunities for teaching and learning in this subject.
- Our entire fire alarm system is being replaced.
- In conjunction with our caterers, Accent, we will be taking delivery of a new external catering pod which will be situated by the field. This will allow us the opportunity to provide “grab and go” items at break and lunch times without the need for students to go to the canteen, thereby hopefully also alleviating some of the queue pressures there.
- As a result of a recent successful Government bid, we are having lots of electrical works completed, including the replacement of all our main fuse boards.



There are a number of other projects also planned, some of which unfortunately cannot be completed over the summer due to availability of contractors, but will be completed as soon as possible once we return:

- There will be a new canopy erected between English and Humanities, with additional tables and benching providing a further outside covered seating area.
- Refurbishment and enlargement of existing toilets to create a new 15 cubicle unisex facility.
- Replacement of the lighting in Da Vinci Hall and Sports Hall

And so as always the school never stops improving, looking for ways in which we can make the learning experience for our whole school community an even better one. The summer holidays are always a busy time for us, but exciting too.

We hope you all have a wonderful relaxing holiday and we will see you in September.

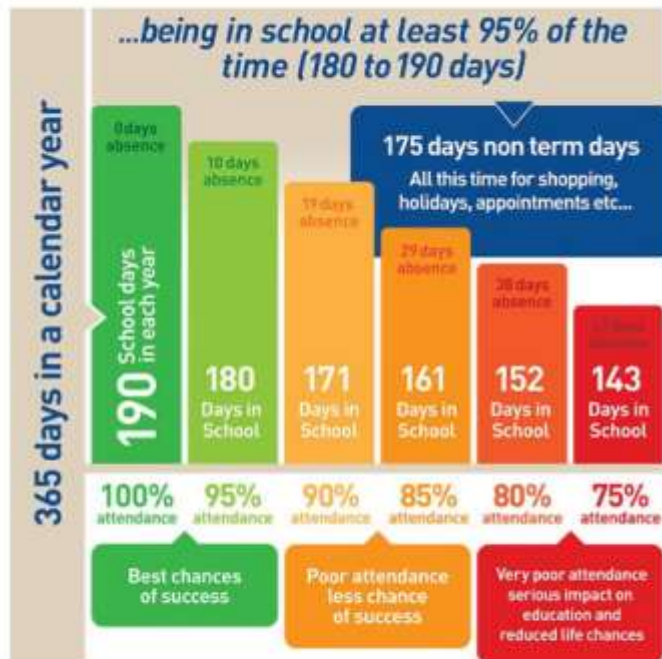

### How will absences from school affect my child's progress at school?

#### Attainment Levels

The quality of school work and qualifications gained will be significantly lower if attendance is lower.

#### School Routine

Your child's learning could be disrupted by the missing of vital class work.

A young person's well-being and long-term life opportunities may be adversely affected by the missing of positive experiences associated with school and learning.

The School expects all students to aim for 100% attendance. 96% attendance is regarded as good and can be achieved with some illness. Any attendance that creates cause for concern would initiate intervention by the school.

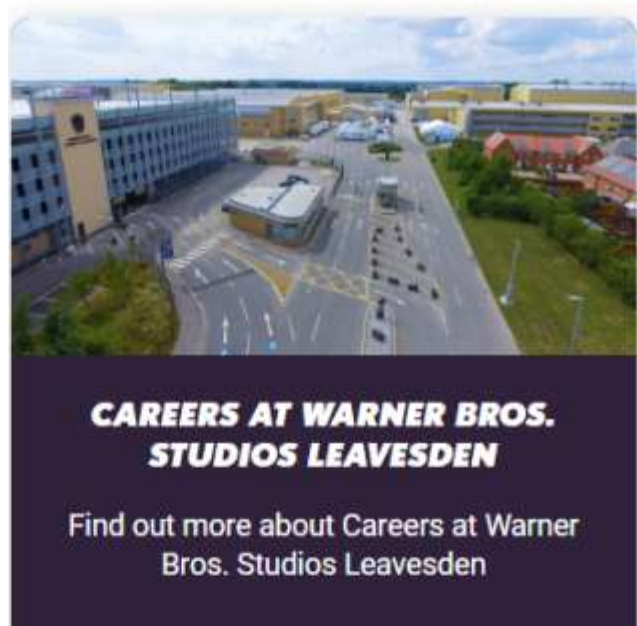

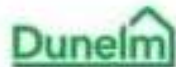
